

Certain medications may interfere with your stem cell procedure. Please complete the <u>Medical History Form</u> and include all medications, supplements, and hormones you are taking. This is reviewed to ensure there are no contraindications and to confirm if you need to adjust or withhold any medications for a specified period prior to, during, or after your procedure.

Through our research and experience, we have found certain medications can inhibit cell growth in culture or have a detrimental effect on healing. Based on our clinical experience or published medical research, the medications/products listed below have been shown to be particularly problematic and must be stopped. Some medications may not be safe to abruptly discontinue, so you must check with your Regenexx doctor, who may have you contact your prescribing physician as well. **Do not stop any prescribed drug without speaking to a physician**.

In an effort to optimize your outcome, please adhere to the below recommendations.

Tobacco, nicotine	Cigarettes, chewing tobacco, cigars, e-cigarette.			Tobacco inhibits blood flow, decreases healing, impairs cell production and function. Should be stopped immediately for multiple reasons.
Artificial Sweeteners	Products with aspartame, acesulfame K, NutraSweet, saccharin, Splenda, sucralose, Sweet'N Low. Found in many diet sodas and other diet or zero calorie beverages.			Products with stevia or sugar alcohols, such as erythritol, sorbitol, xylitol, etc. are okay.



If you are taking a medication or supplement that is not on the above list of restricted medications, please consult your prescribing physician about the following:

MEDICATION

- If possible, stop the medication 1 2 weeks before your <u>BMA</u> and <u>re-injection blood draw(s)</u>.
- If it is **not** possible to come off the medication for **1 2 weeks**, please stop **3 5 days** prior to your <u>BMA</u> and re-injection blood draw(s). This will allow time for your blood to be cleared of the drug, so it will be less likely to interfere with the culturing process.
- You can resume taking your medication after your procedures.
- If you take blood thinners, such as Plavix or Coumadin, ensure that you receive authorization from your physician before commencing supplementation with Turmeric or Fish Oil because it may increase the risk of bleeding.
- Discontinue fish oil at least 2 weeks before any surgeries.

SUPPLEMENTS

- Should be stopped at least 3 5 days before your BMA and re-injection blood draw(s).
- You can resume taking your supplements **2 5 days** after your <u>BMA</u> and re-injection blood draw(s).
- The Regenexx Stem Cell Support Supplement and Regenexx Turmeric/Curcumin Complex do not need to be stopped.

EXCEPTIONS FOR PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS

You may continue to take thyroid medication and hormone therapy, but should avoid abrupt changes within 1 - 2 weeks before or after your procedures. This includes male or female hormone replacement, including thyroid hormones, estrogen, progesterone, testosterone, and growth hormone like Norditropin. This does not include Human Chorionic Gonadotropin (HCG) which should be stopped.

OTHERS

- Do not donate whole blood (standard donation) **2 months prior** to your BMA. Please also refrain from donating whole blood until **2 months after** your last injection.
- Do not donate Power Red (double-red cell) blood 4 months prior to your BMA. Please also refrain from donating Power Red blood until 4 months after your last injection.
